



Headline: Now White House collecting your personal info

A lawsuit has been filed by a consumer-privacy organization demanding answers from the federal government about a program by the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, an executive branch office under the control of the Obama White House, to collect database information about Americans from the CIA, the FBI and the Department of Homeland Security. According to the Electronic Privacy Information Center, which for nearly 20 years has focused its attention on the civil liberties, privacy, First Amendment and constitutional issues related to electronic data, under Washington's revised guidelines, "The ODNI plans to obtain and integrate databases containing detailed personal information from across the federal government." "The data will be kept for up to five years without the legal safeguards typically in place for personal data held by government agencies," the organization explained.

Headline: IMF Pushes EU Lenders To Reduce Greece's Debt

The International Monetary Fund, facing discontent among its members about the huge sums it has lent to the euro zone, is pushing the currency bloc's governments to take steps to lighten the burden of the bailout loans they made to Athens, officials familiar with continuing discussions said. The IMF pressure—which officials said has been clear in private discussions among Greece's official lenders—comes in response to mounting evidence that Greece's deep recession has thrown the country's bailout program woefully off track from targets set earlier this year. IMF officials maintain Greece's debt must be reduced to "sustainable" levels before the fund releases billions more euros to keep Athens from running out of cash, some officials said. The most effective way to do this would be for Greece's bailout lenders to forgive some of the debts Greece owes them.

Headline: Nigeria church attack in Kogi state 'kills 19'

At least 19 people have been killed in a gun attack on a church in central Nigeria, officials say. Gunmen stormed the church near the city of Okene in Kogi state and fired on worshippers, they say. The pastor was among those killed when the assailants fired Kalashnikov assault rifles, the officials add. It is not clear who carried out the attack but militant Islamist group Boko Haram has carried out numerous raids on churches and other targets in Nigeria. BBC Nigeria correspondent Will Ross says the shooting happened further south than most areas affected by Boko Haram violence. The joint military force commander in Kogi state, Lt Col Gabriel Olorunyomi, said the gunmen opened fire on the Deeper Life Bible Church in the town of Otite, near Okene, the AP news agency reports. Many others were wounded in the attack and rushed to different hospitals, Lt Col Gabriel Olorunyomi said.

Headline: Drought conditions affect 20,000 farmers in Sri Lanka

Drought conditions in Sri Lanka have hit more than 20,000 farmers and destroyed 16,000 acres of rice fields in the Indian Ocean island nation, officials said. The government has allocated 3.7 billion rupees, or \$28 million, to provide relief to those affected, but Disaster Management Minister Mahinda Amaraweera said additional allocations would be needed as drought conditions are engulfing more areas in the affected north-central and northwestern provinces, Colombo Page reported. Current plans call for providing farmers in the five drought-affected districts chemical fertilizer and seeds free of cost for the next sowing season in

addition giving financial help to each farmer family. Separately, Sri Lankan President Mahinda Rajapaksa instructed authorities to take immediate steps to prevent deforestation of areas sustaining natural water bodies and build reservoirs for agriculture in the hill country, Colombo Page reported. He asked them to take stern action against those destroying resources through timber smuggling or involved in animal poaching. Sri Lanka recently received a \$ 64.9 million loan from the Export-Import Bank of the United States to finance construction of three water supply systems.

Headline: Floods paralyze Philippine capital Manila

At least nine people have been reported dead as torrential rain caused flooding that paralysed most parts of the Philippine capital, Manila. The flooding - neck-deep in some areas - forced tens of thousands of people to flee their homes, closing schools, offices and the stock exchange. Nine members of one family died after a landslide hit shanty houses in Quezon City, a government report said. More than 50 people died when Typhoon Saola struck more than a week ago. Widespread flooding has been reported in the capital and the surrounding provinces, according to a statement from the [National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council](#). It said "the south-west monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm 'Haikui' located 300km [184 miles] north-east of Taiwan" was expected to bring more rain.

Headline: Weekend storms wreak havoc in Austria and northern Italy

Storms wreaked havoc in Austria and northern Italy over the weekend, causing landslides that killed two people, authorities said Sunday. An 84-year-old woman was killed when a landslide hit a farm in Afens, on the Italian side of the border with Austria. In nearby Tulfes, the body of another woman who had been declared missing after her house was struck by a mud flow was uncovered on Sunday morning. Major storms lashed much of Austria and German-speaking northern Italy late Saturday, causing flooding and power cuts, and disrupting rail and road connections. About 1,000 homes were without electricity Sunday morning in the Virgental valley in southern Austria. In South Tyrol, a northern province of Italy also known as Alto Adige, some 500 emergency workers, firefighters and civil protection officers were mobilized to deal with the damages. The rail line between Austria and Italy over the Brenner Pass was buried by a landslide overnight and was expected to remain shut for two weeks. Road and rail connections were also shut elsewhere in Austria, including in Tyrol, Styria and Salzburg provinces. Most were due to re-open on Sunday but others remained closed due to a further risk of landslides. In Styria, several houses had to be evacuated after they were flooded, and cellars in northern Austria were also filled with water following heavy rain. A few barns meanwhile went up in flames after they were hit by lightning, with over 250 animals perishing at one farm in northern Austria

Headline: Tropical Storm Ernesto swirls off Honduras coast

Headline: Ernesto likely to become hurricane, hit Mexico's Yucatan

Tropical Storm Ernesto swirled along Honduras' northern coast early Tuesday, bringing the threat of torrential rains as it headed toward landfall as a possible hurricane near Mexico's border with Belize. Nicaraguan authorities moved some people from low-lying areas, while Honduran officials urged people along its Caribbean coast to stay alert. With Ernesto predicted to stay at sea while passing along Honduras' northern coast during the day, Honduran authorities were monitoring the storm but there were no immediate plans to evacuate people, Roberto Diaz, operations chief of the country's Contingencies Commission, said Monday night. "We don't think it is necessary to evacuate people at this point," Diaz said. "We don't want to create collective panic ... and we think that ordering an evacuation would create hysteria that would affect the population more than the storm itself."

Headline: Typhoon-related deaths hit 23 in China

China's eastern coastal regions Tuesday reeled under the onslaught of twin typhoons as the death toll from storm-related incidents rose to 23, authorities said. Nine more people were listed as missing as Typhoons Damrey and Saola, which came ashore during the weekend, continued to spread havoc, in the regions, Xinhua News Agency reported. In Hubei province alone, one of the seven provinces hit by the storms, 14 people had been confirmed dead and another five were missing as of Monday evening. The province was struck by Saola, which came ashore in China after striking the northern Philippines and Taiwan, where it left at least 23 people dead. Saola and Damrey brought with them heavy rainstorms, which triggered flooding and mudslides in several regions, Xinhua reported.



Headline: 'Israeli regime plots to Judaize al-Aqsa mosque'

The *Islamic-Christian* Committee for Protecting al-Quds and the Holy Sites has warned of plots devised by the Israeli regime to Judaize al-Aqsa mosque in al-Quds (Jerusalem). According to the Palestinian Information Center, the committee issued a statement on Sunday, warning that the Tel Aviv regime is seeking to divide the holy mosque the way it divided the Sanctuary of Abraham in the West Bank city of al-Khalil. Over the past few weeks, the Israeli regime has increased assaults on the al-Aqsa mosque to destroy the holy Muslim site, the statement said. Reports say Tel Aviv has used chemical substances to damage the structure of the al-Aqsa mosque. In addition, Tel Aviv authorities recently said the regime had plans to turn the al-Aqsa environment into parks and public places for Israelis.

Headline: Timber! Israel blamed for falling trees in Jerusalem

Two tumbling trees on Jerusalem's Temple Mount have caused a Palestinian organization to accuse Israel of undermining the foundations of the Al-Aqsa Mosque. The Al-Aqsa Foundation for Endowment and Heritage, an NGO based in the Israeli-Arab city of Umm al-Fahm and dedicated to documenting Israeli "assaults" on the Temple Mount, reported Monday that an old palm tree collapsed on the Temple Mount Sunday. A day earlier, another ancient tree reportedly fell to the ground to the east of the Al-Aqsa Mosque, near the Golden Gate on the Temple Mount. The organization cited "Israeli digging under the Temple Mount" as the reason for the trees' collapse. Another theory it offered was that "settlers" sprayed poisonous chemical substances on the trees, causing their decay. The foundation, which also reported cracks on the ground of the Temple Mount plaza, claimed that "it is well-known that Israeli occupation digging along the western wall of the Al-Aqsa Mosque" has been going on for years. On July 31, the foundation released a report warning of Israeli attempts to supplant the Al-Aqsa Mosque with a third Jewish Temple.

Headline: Palestinian PM Fayyad calls for parliament vote

Headline: Abbas Receives Blair, Calls for Financial Support

The Palestinian prime minister in the West Bank has said that Palestinians should hold parliament elections in the territory soon, instead of waiting for the elusive reconciliation with Gaza's Hamas rulers. Salam Fayyad compared the Palestinian split - with rival governments in the West Bank and Gaza since 2007 - to the decades-long division of Germany. Fayyad, who spoke to reporters late Monday, appeared to be challenging his boss, Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas, and Abbas' Islamic militant Hamas rivals. Meanwhile, President Mahmoud Abbas Tuesday received Quartet representative Tony Blair in the presidential headquarters, in Ramallah and called to support the Palestinian Authority financially. Abbas briefed Blair on the latest political developments and the dilemma the peace process is facing due to the Israeli government's intransigence and refusal to abide by the international law. Abbas insisted on the importance of providing financial support to PA, especially during the critical financial situation it is going through.

Headline: Israel considers more Egyptian troops in Sinai

Israel will consider any Egyptian request to deploy additional military forces in the Sinai in an effort to retake control of the peninsula and weed out a global jihad terrorist infrastructure, defense officials said on Monday. An Egyptian request was expected to come in the aftermath of a sophisticated [cross-border attack Sunday night](#) that was thwarted by the IDF after terrorists stole an armored vehicle and infiltrated into Israel. The IDF revealed on Monday that eight terrorists had been killed and at least six of them were wearing explosive belts. The IDF said the attackers were part of a global jihad terrorist infrastructure operating inside the Sinai that was made up mostly of local Bedouin. During the attack, some 35 armed men stormed an Egyptian military base, killing 16 policemen and soldiers. On Monday, Egypt branded the attackers "infidels" and vowed to launch a crackdown throughout the Sinai.

Headline: Al-Qaida leader's brother threatens Israel

Al-Qaida not only is continuing its efforts to extend its influence over Syria and Lebanon, now it has renewed threats against Israel. Mohamed al-Zawahiri, the brother of al-Qaida leader Ayman al-Zawahiri, has threatened to target Israel, according to a report in Joseph Farah's G2 Bulletin. Recently released from an Egyptian prison, the younger brother to the al-Qaida leader said that al-Qaida will hit Israel "if it gets the chance," he told leading Egyptian newspaper al-Masry al-Youm in a recent interview. The increasing influx of al-Qaida and Salafists in assisting the Syrian opposition makes the other countries in the region potential staging areas if the group is successful in occupying them. Under these circumstances, Israel then could be increasingly vulnerable to al-Qaida attacks.

Headline: Saudi Arabia Fears Spread Of Shi'ite Protests In Country

Saudi anti-regime protesters have once again held rallies in the city of Qatif in Eastern Province to protest against police crackdown on demonstrators. Chanting anti-Al Saud slogans, the protesters called for the release of prominent Shia cleric Nemr al-Nemr, who was injured and detained in the city in July, while on his way back home. Al-Nemr's arrest sparked massive protests, with angry demonstrators demanding his immediate release. The Shia cleric has been severely tortured by Saudi security forces in jail. The Saudi protesters also expressed solidarity with anti-regime protesters in Bahrain, who have been brutally suppressed by the Saudi-backed forces of the Persian Gulf island state.

Headline: Egyptian Protesters Demand to End Ties with Israel

Dozens of members from Youth for Freedom and Justice, the April 6 Youth movement, and Kefaya, The Egyptian Movement for Change, organized a march to the home of the Israeli Ambassador in Maadi to protest the killing of 16 security officers near the Egyptian-Israeli border on Sunday afternoon. The protesters called for the expulsion of the Ambassador and to punish those who perpetrated or colluded in the attack. Officials from Egypt and Israel said the attackers belonged to extremist Islamist groups in Sinai, but Islamist politicians and observers in Egypt said they suspect that Israel was behind the incident.

Headline: Aleppo rebels shelled as 91 killed across Syria, activists say

Headline: Syrian forces encircle rebels in Aleppo stronghold

Syria's army shelled rebel-held areas of *Aleppo* on *Monday* as violence killed 91 people across the country, including 57 civilians, 24 troops and 10 rebels, a watchdog said. At least 17 civilians were killed in the city of Aleppo, while four were killed elsewhere in the same province, said the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights. Clashes broke out in the southwestern district of Salaheddin, where a rebel commander and another fighter were killed on Monday after three tanks moved in the night before, said the Britain-based group. "Rebels and regime forces also clashed fiercely in the Shaar, Hanano and Sakhur districts," it said, adding that six civilians were killed in Sakhur alone. Shaar and Sakhur later came under regime shelling, as did the neighborhoods of Saif al-Dawla and Bab al-Hadid. The army bombarded the Palace of Justice, as well as the districts of Marjeh and Shaar, killing five people. In Bab al-Nayrab, troops shot dead a civilian while he was helping wounded people, it added. In *Damascus*, clashes broke out in the Sheikh Ibrahim area of Rokn Eddin district, where four civilians were killed. Syrian rebels trying to fight off an army offensive in Aleppo said on Tuesday they were running low on ammunition as Syrian President Bashar Assad's forces encircled their stronghold at the southern entrance to the country's biggest city.

Headline: Faced with growing wave of defections, Assad makes first television appearance in two weeks

Syrian President Bashar Assad appeared on television for the first time in two weeks on Tuesday in footage showing him meeting Saeed Jalili, the head of Iran's Supreme National Security Council, in Damascus. Assad's appearance came the day after his prime minister defected to rebels who have been waging a 17-month campaign to oust him. Assad's absence had fuelled rumors about his health, including a hoax Twitter message on Monday that quoted Russia's ambassador to Damascus as saying Assad might have been killed.

Russian officials quickly denied the report.

Headline: Iran threatens US, Turkey after Israel with spreading Syrian conflict

Iranian Foreign Minister Ali Akbar Salehi is to pay a snap visit to *Turkey* late Tuesday for talks on the *Syrian* crisis and 48 Iranians kidnapped there. The Iranian foreign minister wanted to visit Turkey "at his own request," which was conveyed through diplomatic channels late Monday, a Turkish diplomat told AFP, speaking on condition of anonymity. Salehi will hold talks with his Turkish counterpart Ahmet Davutoglu in Ankara, with the Syria conflict topping the agenda, he added. Meanwhile Saeed Jalili, a top aide to Iran's supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, arrived in *Damascus* on a surprise visit on Tuesday for talks with Assad, Iranian state television reported. Jalili, the head of Iran's supreme national security council, flew in from Beirut, where he held talks on Monday with *Lebanese* leaders. He was to meet Assad within the hour. After the meeting, Jalili was to give a news conference in the Syrian capital, Iranian state broadcaster IRIB said on its website. In Beirut on Monday, Jalili issued a veiled warning to countries backing the Syrian rebels. "Those who believe that, by developing insecurity in the countries of the region by sending arms and exporting terrorism, they are buying security for themselves are wrong," he told Lebanese Foreign Minister Adnan Mansour, according to the official news agency IRNA.

Headline: Iraq to "review" relations after Turkish FM visit

Iraq is to "review" relations with Turkey after Ankara's foreign minister visited the disputed northern Iraqi city of Kirkuk without informing Baghdad, government spokesperson Ali al-Dabbagh said on Tuesday. Turkish Foreign Minister Ahmet Davutoglu's visit to Kirkuk on August 2 drew a furious reaction from Baghdad and brought already-chilly relations between the two countries to a new low. "The cabinet studied recent developments in Turkish-Iraqi relations and decided to review these relations in light of recent developments in a new cabinet meeting as soon as possible," Dabbagh said in an emailed statement. The cabinet also decided to form a committee headed by Deputy Prime Minister Hussein al-Shahristani "to investigate the circumstances of the Turkish foreign minister's visit to Kirkuk and present recommendations to the cabinet," he said.

Headline: Iraq attacks leave nine dead

Nine people, amongst them two government employees, were killed in a spate of attacks across Iraq on Tuesday. Armed gunmen killed two Iraqi government employees in separate attacks in Baghdad. An Iraqi security source said that "unarmed gunmen opened fire on the car of a Ministry of Justice employee with silenced weapons as he traveled down the highway near the university district in western Baghdad." The source added that "other gunmen, also armed with silenced guns, shot at an employee of the Ministry of Agriculture as he was driving his car down the highway in the southwester district of Amil. He died on the spot and the attackers fled." Meanwhile, in the northwestern city of Hilla in Babel province, an Iraqi woman and four of her children were killed in explosions that allegedly targeted her husband. Last month, Iraq witnessed its deadliest violence in almost two years, with 325 people killed in attacks.

Headline: More Syrians flee to Turkey as fighting spreads

Headline: Syrian Kurds warn Turkey against intervention

More than 1,300 Syrians fled to Turkey overnight to escape growing violence in their country as rebels try to expand their hold inside Syria's largest city despite two weeks of withering counterattacks by President Bashar Assad's troops. Heavily armed government troops have been steadily shelling rebel-controlled parts of the city, particularly Salaheddine and other districts on the southwestern edge of Aleppo as the two sides fight for control over the strategic city. Aleppo-based activists said clashes were going on Tuesday near the historic city center in Bab Jnein and Sabee Bahrat districts, suggesting the rebels were making some inroads. They said intense bombardment of the town of Tal Rifaat near the Turkish border sent scores of people spilling into Turkey for safety.

Headline: Bomb Attack Kills 9 Near Afghan Capital

Headline: Afghan defense minister quits

A roadside bomb killed nine people Tuesday near the Afghan capital and a bomber rammed his truck into a NATO base in eastern Afghanistan. In the first attack, a remote-controlled blast hit a bus traveling across a bridge west of Kabul. Nine civilians were killed and at least five others were wounded. The local police chief says the person who planted the bomb has been arrested. Authorities also say a bomber detonated a truck full of explosives outside a NATO base in Pul-i-Alam, the capital of Logar province, wounding at least 11 civilians. The Taliban claimed responsibility for the attack. NATO said the attack "failed to cause any significant damage to the base, but did result in the severe injury of a number of innocent Afghan civilians." The coalition condemned Tuesday's "inhumane" violence, as examples of the "insurgency's destructive, vicious disregard for the Afghan people."

Headline: Sudan troops move on looted town, 2 dead

Two Sudanese soldiers were killed when the army moved in to restore order in a Darfur town after unrest that followed the killing in an ambush of a local official, state-linked media said on Sunday. The army's deployment inside Kutum, in North Darfur state, is unusual as civic law enforcement is normally a police responsibility. Troops moved to stop "outlaws" who were looting after the killing last Wednesday of Abdelrahman Mohammed Eissa, the head of North Darfur's Al-Waha district, Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) spokesman Sawarmi Khaled Saad was quoted as saying by the Sudanese Media Centre, which is close to the security apparatus. "In this intervention SAF lost two martyrs and two were wounded," Saad said. Eissa died from gunshot wounds after an ambush and theft of his car in Kutum, official media reported. Such attacks on government officials are rare in Sudan.

Headline: **Kuwaiti parliament fails to meet again as crisis continues**

Kuwait's parliament failed to meet on Tuesday for the second week in a row as a majority of lawmakers boycotted the session amid an ongoing political crisis in the Gulf state. Speaker Jassem Al-Khorafi indefinitely adjourned parliament – which was dissolved in December but reinstated by a court ruling in June – after only four of the 50-member house and several ministers turned up. He said he will refer the issue to the emir, Sheikh Sabah al-Ahmad Al-Sabah, who is expected to dissolve parliament and call for fresh polls, the fifth since June 2006. Opposition MPs boycotted parliament claiming it is illegitimate, while pro-government MPs are angry because the house will most likely be dissolved. The parliament was elected in 2009 and dissolved following youth-led protests but was revived on June 20 when the constitutional court nullified the February polls and scrapped the opposition-dominated new parliament. A date for

dissolving the revived parliament remains unknown as the government is reportedly preparing to refer the electoral law to the constitutional court on suspicion that it breaches the constitution.

Headline: Romanian minister resigns over row

Romanian Interior Minister Ioan Rus resigned yesterday, citing “unacceptable” pressures amid controversy over his ministry’s organization of an impeachment referendum against president Traian Basescu.

“I have submitted my resignation for my own honor,” said Rus, a member of Prime Minister Victor Ponta’s center-left coalition, the Social Liberal Union (USL). Condemning “criticism and pressure” from political figures, including both suspended center-right president Basescu and interim president Crin Antonescu, Rus also announced the resignation of Victor Dobre, the junior interior minister tasked with organizing the vote. “We have been subjected to multiple forms of pressure, discussions, and criticism, coming from Romanian political figures from Traian Basescu to Crin Antonescu,” he said. “From my point of view and from (Dobre’s) point of view, these things are unacceptable. “We think we organized this referendum sufficiently well.”

Romanian politics have been thrown into turmoil by the July 29 impeachment referendum, which has been sharply criticized by the European Union and the United States.

On Monday, a Tibetan monk from Kirti Monastery self-immolated in the town of Ngaba, according to reports by Free Tibet and Radio Free Asia, which is financed by the United States government.
