



***The Door to Hell: Take a look inside a giant hole in the desert which has been on fire for more than 40 YEARS**

According to the Daily Mail, there is a hole burning in Turkmenistan. They say Soviet geologists were drilling at the site in 1971 and tapped into a cavern filled with natural gas. ***NSA Wants “EZ Pass” Control for Internet**

***More Law Enforcement Agencies Turning To “Pre-Crime” Policing**

General Keith Alexander, the NSA boss, wants the government to centralize the internet and force users to use a system analogous to EZ Pass. EZ Pass is an RFID transponder system used for toll collection on roads, bridges, and tunnels in the United States. “What we need for cybersecurity is something analogous to that,” [Alexander](#) told the annual Def Con computer hacking conference in Las Vegas.. “Think of us as the EZ Pass on the highway.” “When you go down the highway, and you go down the EZ Pass lane, what you’re doing is sending that code. That system is not looking in your car, reading the e-mail, or intercepting anything, it’s just getting that code,” he said. In other words, the government should vet all users with a checkpoint. “All you need to pass is the fact of a signature and IP address in real time, and we can take it from there,” said Alexander.

***DOJ Suggests Criticism of Islam Could Be Criminalized**

In refusing to rule out a future law that would criminalize criticism of religion as racist hate speech, the Department of Justice has left the door open to the prospect of Shariah-style law in the United States that would forbid criticism of Islam. During a House Judiciary Committee Subcommittee on the Constitution, Rep. Trent Franks (R-Ariz) questioned Assistant Attorney General Tom Perez on whether the Justice Department would ever consider banning free speech critical of religion. “Will you tell us here today simply that this Administration’s Department of Justice will never entertain or advance a proposal that criminalizes speech against any religion?” asked Franks. Perez replied by asking for context before Franks repeated the question, adding, “That’s not a hard question.” Perez then tried to add the context of “when you make threats against someone,” but Franks stuck to his original question and repeated it for a third time. “If the Department of Justice can’t even answer whether they will entertain or advance a proposal that

criminalizes speech against any religion, then it's pretty late in the day," concluded Franks. Perez' evasive response clearly indicates that the Department of Justice under the Obama administration would consider a law that would override the First Amendment and classify criticism of religion as racist hate speech. The mere fact that Perez refused to rule it out is shocking.

***Euro zone jobless rate hits record high, inflation static**

Inflation in the euro zone remained steady for the third straight month in July, offering little comfort to consumers at a time when the number of people out of work continues to climb and the unemployment rate hit a record high. Consumer prices in the 17 nations sharing the euro rose 2.4 per cent in July on an annual basis, the EU's statistics office Eurostat said on Tuesday, maintaining a level first touched in May as Brent crude fell sharply and brought prices down.

***Talks come up short on Greek budget cuts**

***Greek leaders to meet again Wednesday on austerity measures**

The three parties in Greece's young coalition government failed Monday to finalize a major new package of budget savings that rescue lenders are demanding as a condition for continued bailout funds the country needs to avoid getting forced out of the eurozone. But junior coalition partners said the meeting under conservative Prime Minister Antonis Samaras reached an agreement on the debt-crippled country's "overall strategy" — including that it should obtain a two-year extension on its austerity and reform deadlines. Finance Minister Yannis Stournaras told journalists that the government is still working to precisely identify what kinds of spending cuts to include in the new \$14.1 billion package for 2013-14, although the three coalition partners have signed off on the bulk of the plan.

***Oxford University Introduces Transgender-Friendly Dress Code**

Oxford University has rewritten the laws governing its strict academic dress code following concerns that they were unfair towards transgender students. Under the new regulations, students taking exams or attending formal occasions will no longer have to wear ceremonial clothing that is specific to their gender. It will mean men will be able to sit tests in skirts and stockings and women will have the option of wearing suits and bow ties. The new laws, which will come into force next week, comes after a motion put forward the university's Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans and Queer society (LGBTQ Soc) was passed by the student union. Jess Pumphrey, LGBTQ Soc's executive officer, said the change will make a number of students' exam experience significantly less stressful. She told The Oxford Student newspaper: "In future there will be no need for transgender students to cross-dress to avoid being confronted by invigilators or disciplined during their exam."

***Vietnam Considering Gay Marriage, First Asian Nation to Push for Redefinition**

Vietnam is considering drafting a law that would legalize same-sex marriage, making it the first Asian country to break away from the traditional definition of marriage. The Justice Ministry proposed to make amendments to the country's marriage law by including same-sex couples in the definition, The Associated Press reported on Sunday. A new law would also clarify disputes between same-sex couples living together, and address issues such as owning property, inheriting assets and adopting children. "I think, as far as human rights are concerned, it's time for us to look at the reality," said Justice Minister Ha Hung Cuong last week. "The number of homosexuals has mounted to hundreds of thousands. It's not a small figure. They live together without registering marriage. They may own property. We, of course, have to handle these issues legally."

***Drought strains U.S. oil production**

One of the worst droughts in U.S. history is hampering oil production, pitting farmers against oilmen and highlighting just how dependent on water modern U.S. energy development has become. Over 60% of the nation is in some form of drought. Areas affected include West Texas, North Dakota, Kansas, Colorado and Pennsylvania, all of which are part of the recent boom in North American energy production. That boom is possible partly by hydraulic fracturing. Known as fracking for short, the controversial practice gets oil and natural gas to flow by cracking shale rock with sand, chemicals, pressure and water. Lots of water. Each shale well takes between two and 12 million gallons of water to frack. That's 18 Olympic-sized swimming pools worth of water per well. "We're having difficulty acquiring water," said Chris Faulkner, CEO of Breitling Oil and Gas, an oil company with operations in many of the new shale regions including Bakken in North Dakota and Marcellus in Pennsylvania.

***Typhoon toll up, more storms forecast**

Northern Philippines, in the grips of Typhoon Saola, faced more severe weather Tuesday as the death toll from the storm climbed, officials said. Luzon, the country's largest island and home to the capital Manila, and parts of the island of Visayas, have taken the brunt of the storm, locally called Gener, which intensified to a typhoon Monday. The government's National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council Tuesday raised the number of people confirmed killed in the storm to seven, including a 10-year-old boy, as more rains and strong winds lashed the region, the Philippine Star reported. The disaster relief agency said most of the victims had drowned. The report said about 8,300 families had been affected in 14 provinces in Luzon, parts of Visayas and Mindanao.

***Just another day in Arizona: another day; another massive dust storm**

A second cloud of yellow in less than a week overwhelmed suburban Phoenix on Sunday, mixing with torrential rains and gusty winds that wreaked havoc on midday traffic in the area. The thick wall of dust, known as a haboob, which is Arabic for 'strong wind,' was seen making its way through the town of Laveen about eight miles southwest of downtown Phoenix. The greater Phoenix area and northwest and north central Pinal County were under a dust storm warning that expired at 7pm on Sunday. This comes just days after an enormous dust cloud measuring around 2,000 feet tall and almost 100km wide swept over the city, traveling at 35mph. The dust cut power to some 9,000 homes and caused disruptions at the local airport. Caused by Arizona's monsoon season which begins in early June and runs through till the end of September, haboob's only occur in Africa, the Middle East, Australia and Phoenix, Arizona. Known as the grand daddy of dust storms, the haboob is a rare event and is caused by loose dust being blown upwards in the absence of rain and collecting skywards where it is then propelled by another more distant thunderstorm brewing behind it. Despite some of the 1.5 million residents of Phoenix objecting to the term haboob being used, meteorologists in the city confirmed that they have been using the Arabic word to describe the massive dust storms for over 30 years. 'I think what's going on is that we've had a higher frequency of stronger dust storms over the last couple of years and the term has been in play much more because of that,' said Ken Waters of the Phoenix National Weather Service office to KPHO. Blowing gusts of up to 50 mph at Phoenix Sky Harbor Airport, the haboob is destructive because of the fine dust particles that manage to permeate everywhere during the storm.

***Rare Mountain Tornado Touches Down Near Mount Evans**

It doesn't happen very often, but Colorado had a rare mountain tornado touchdown near Mount Evans. Saturday afternoon at 2:51 pm. Thunderstorms strengthening over the mountains west of Denver were strong enough to produce a weak, short-lived twister. The National Weather Service has analyzed pictures from the area and confirms that it was a bona fide tornado. Typically, these types of storms can produce what are known as cold air funnels. Which are not tornadoes but do develop from cold air pooling in the upper levels of a thunderstorm. And with differing temperatures at altitude wind shear can cause a funnel-shaped cloud to drop from a thunderstorm. These funnels tend to be very weak and almost never touch the ground. But in this situation the air entering the bottom of this Mount Evans storm was warm enough to produce a tornado touchdown. The National Weather Service is estimating this to be the second highest tornado ever recorded in the United States. The spot where the touchdown occurred to be roughly at 11,900 feet.

***Jordan fears Assad agents are among flood of refugees**

Jordan has toughened policy toward the 150,000 Syrian refugees in the Hashemite kingdom. Officials said Jordan's intelligence and security agencies were interrogating and monitoring Syrian refugees who fled the Sunni revolt against President Bashar Assad. The officials said the intelligence community has assessed that the Assad regime was sending agents to destabilize Jordan. "There are increasing incidents of violence and sabotage in northern Jordan linked to the Syrians," a security source said. An estimated 150,000 Syrians have arrived in Jordan since the revolt erupted in March 2011. Officials said Assad agents were assigned to conduct sabotage and assassinate Syrian opposition activists.

***Saudi silence on intelligence chief Bandar's fate denotes panic**

Disquiet in Washington, Jerusalem and a row of Middle East capitals is gaining ground the longer the Saudi government stays silent on the reports of the assassination of the newly-appointed Saudi intelligence chief Prince Bandar bin Sultan, purportedly in a revenge operation by a Syrian intelligence death squad. If true, it would shoot a devastating tentacle out from the Syrian conflict to the broader region. It is widely feared that Saudi rulers are too traumatized to respond by the fear of Iranian penetration of the highest and most closely guarded circles of Saudi government, possibly climaxing in Bandar's assassination. The unconfirmed reports of his death attribute its motive to revenge by Iran and Syria for the bomb explosion five days earlier in Damascus which killed four of Bashar Assad's top managers of his war on the uprising against his regime. The prince, son of the late crown prince Sultan, has not been seen in public since Saudi General Intelligence headquarters in Riyadh was hit by a bomb blast Monday, July 23 killing his deputy, Mashaal al-Qarni.

***Ban: UN convoy attacked in Syria**

A convoy of unarmed UN observers came under attack in Syria, UN leader Ban Ki-moon said Monday as he expressed mounting concern at the spiraling onslaught by government forces. The five-vehicle convoy which was carrying UN mission chief General Babacar Gaye came under small arms fire near the protest city of Homs, a UN peacekeeping spokesperson said. "Fortunately there were no injuries," Ban told reporters as he announced the attack on Sunday. The convoy was at the village of Talbisa, traveling from the protest city of Homs when one vehicle was hit by three bullets and another by one bullet, a UN peacekeeping spokesperson, Josephine Guerrero, told AFP. "It was an convoy of five vehicles, which was carrying General Gaye, which came under small arms fire," she said. UN officials said it was not known who had fired the shots.

***Syrian troops clash with rebels near Aleppo intelligence HQ, activists say**

***CNN: Syrian rebels shelling base north of Aleppo with captured tanks**

***Forty Syrian police killed as rebels overrun Aleppo posts, activists say**

Syrian troops and rebels fought pitched battles near an intelligence headquarters in Aleppo on Tuesday, a watchdog said, as a military offensive in Syria's commercial capital raged into a fourth day. The fighting erupted when rebels launched an assault before dawn on the powerful Air Force Intelligence branch in Aleppo's Zahraa district, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said. Fighting was continuing into the day. Also Tuesday, rebels armed with rocket propelled grenades attacked Aleppo's main military court as well as a police station and a branch of the ruling Baath Party in the city's southern Salhin district, the Britain-based Observatory said. Meanwhile, the neighborhoods of Firdoss, Al-Mashhad and Ansari were bombarded through the night by government troops, the watchdog said. Fighting also flared in the southwestern district of Salaheddin, the rebels' main bastion in Aleppo, which was strafed by government helicopter gunships, according to the Syrian Revolution General Committee, a network of activists on the ground. A security official in Damascus told AFP on Monday that the army had regained some of Salaheddin but it was facing "a very strong resistance." The rebels, however, denied that the army had advanced even "one meter."

***Humanitarian problems grow in besieged Aleppo**

Humanitarian conditions have grown even more dire in the besieged Syria city of Aleppo with activists reporting on Tuesday dwindling stocks of food and cooking gas and only intermittent electricity supplies as droves of residents flee 11 days of intense clashes between rebels and regime forces. Government helicopters pounded rebel neighborhoods across Syria's largest city and main commercial hub. Activists said the random shelling has forced many civilians to flee to other neighborhoods or even escape the city altogether. The U.N. said late Sunday that about 200,000 had fled the city of about 3 million.

***Key U.S. lawmakers agree on new Iran sanctions**

***Iran's Ahmadinejad calls sanctions 'ridiculous'**

U.S. lawmakers are a step closer to finalizing new sanctions aimed at further restricting Iran's oil revenues after negotiators from the Senate and House of Representatives agreed upon a compromise bill on Monday. If passed, the sanctions will add additional pressure on top of penalties imposed by the United States and European Union earlier this year on countries that fail to slash purchases of Iranian oil - sanctions the West hopes will prevent Tehran from building nuclear weapons. Senate and House leaders have said they would like to pass the sanctions by the end of the week, when lawmakers are slated to leave for an extended recess. Votes have not yet been scheduled. U.S. Defense Secretary Leon Panetta acknowledged Monday that increasingly stiff international sanctions have yet to compel Iran to give up its nuclear ambitions. But he argued that more pressure eventually would lead Iran to "do what's right."

***Report: Iran Funding Terror Camp in Iraq**

An Iranian-funded religious academy in Iraq is training approximately 1,500 recruits from Arab countries worldwide to use "combat weapons" and engage in "street fighting," *The Gulf Daily News* reported. Iran has spent \$1 million to establish and fund the camp, according to the report. Training reportedly began over the weekend. According to a report in *Gulf Daily News'* Arabic language sister publication, *Akhbar Al Khaleej*, citizens from Arab nations worldwide have joined the terror training camp. "Apart from members of Hawza Ilmiyya Najab, the religious academy, those being trained include citizens from Bahrain, Saudi Arabia, Syria and other Arab countries, the report adds. Their countries' national flags were flown over the main gate of the camp during the opening ceremony of the camp, it says. Several Iraqi and Iranian officials are said to have attended the training facility's opening ceremonies.

***20 killed in twin Iraq car bombs**

Two cars exploded within five minutes of each other Tuesday, killing 20 people and wounding 57 in an upscale Shiite neighborhood in Iraq's capital, officials said. The afternoon's double blast sent plumes of black smoke over Karradah, a busy shopping district across the Tigris River from the Green Zone. The sounds of gunshots could be heard from blocks away. The violence brought the July death toll to 244 people killed in shootings and bombings in al-Qaida attacks as the terror group seeks to take advantage of political instability in Iraq

***Christians plead for prayer in a violent Iraq**

Last week, a string of bombings killed over 100 people in Iraq. Sunday, July 29, seven Iraqi policemen were killed in two bombings and a drive-by shooting, according to the Associated Press. Violence has spiked all over Iraq this year, and Christians have also been targeted. Believers continue to leave the deathly nation because many who remain are being killed. Open Doors USA recently received this e-mail from one of their contacts in Baghdad: "The terror in Iraq recently was the worst for several years. Each hour the news of what happened gets worse. There have also been major al-Qaeda threats to everyone, especially the Christians. After last week's violence, communication is terrible. "It is not really possible to describe the devastation here in Baghdad. Over 100 have been killed. Security has been a target. We have none. I came back early because things were getting worse, and they sure are! We are all okay, though. "We are used to bad problems here in Baghdad, but the violence is just quite unbelievable. 12 car bombs, 2 suicide bombers on motor bikes. Scores of police and soldiers killed. We no longer have any security. It was all Iraqi police and soldiers. Whilst our people have not been killed, the injuries are so severe to so many. "There have also been new serious threats from Abu Baker Al Hussani, the head of al-Qaeda in Iraq. Despite all of this, we do not give up and do not fear. We keep praising the Holy One who never leaves us. "Well, today has been good and exhausting. In the church we have been looking at Psalm 23. When people ask me what they should pray for us here in Iraq, I say it should be the 3 P's: Protection, Provision and Perseverance. It is these three things that Psalm 23 deals with. Have a look and see what is what." Pray for Iraq and the remaining Christians. Pray that they would remain bold and might have opportunities to share the peace of Christ with frightened community members around them.

President Barack Obama and Turkish Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan spoke by telephone Monday "to coordinate efforts to accelerate a political transition in Syria," the White House said. This "would include the departure of (Syrian leader) Bashar Assad and be responsive to the legitimate demands of the Syrian people," the statement said.

***Syrian daily says Iran has warned Turkey**

Syrian ally Iran has warned their common neighbor Turkey that it will meet a harsh response should Ankara carry out any strikes inside Syrian territory, a pro-Damascus daily reported on Monday. "Any attack on Syrian territory will meet with a harsh response, and the Iranian-Syrian mutual defense agreement will be activated," the *Al-Watan* newspaper said. "Turkey has received very strong warnings in the past few hours and the following message: beware changing the rules of the game," the paper added. Iran is the closest regional ally of embattled Syrian President Bashar al-Assad, but has also striven to keep good relations with Turkey even as the standoff over its controversial nuclear program has deepened with other NATO member states.

***Sudan bombs kill three in Blue Nile: rebels**

***Major protest in Sudan's Darfur: witness**

***Sudan's Bashir turns down summit with South Sudan's Kiir**

Sudanese aerial bombing killed three civilians and wounded 21 in Blue Nile state bordering South Sudan, rebels said on Monday, four days before a UN deadline for the Sudans to make peace. The air strikes on Friday and Saturday left three people dead and 11 wounded in Ora-Balila while four others were hurt in Magaf, said Arnu Ngutulu Lodi, spokesman for the Sudan People's Liberation Movement-North (SPLM-N). Six other people were wounded and more than two dozen head of cattle killed in a bombing at Wadaka Nellei, he added in a statement. Access to Blue Nile is severely restricted, making independent verification of the claims difficult. Sudan's army spokesman could not be reached for comment. Meanwhile, Protesters in Sudan's troubled Darfur region stoned government offices Tuesday during a major protest over rising prices, a witness said, in the country's latest Arab Spring-style demonstration. Police fired tear gas at the demonstrators scattered in groups around the main market of Nyala, the capital of South Darfur state, he said, adding they threw stones at a state-run radio station and another government building, and erected crude roadblocks. "I saw tyres burning in the street," he said. Like other demonstrators in Sudan, they repeated a call made by crowds at Arab Spring protests around the region: "The people want the fall of the regime." Demonstrations in Sudan started on June 16 when University of Khartoum students voiced their opposition to high food prices, starting the longest-running public challenge to the 23-year regime of President Omar al-Bashir.

***Moroccan king vows to press ahead with reforms**

Morocco's King Mohammed VI vowed on Monday to press ahead with reforms, including strengthening the independence of the judiciary and battling corruption, in a speech to mark 13 years on the throne. "Justice, regionalization and territorial governance are among our top priorities," he said in the speech broadcast live on state television. But equally important are the provisions "of the new constitution, relating to good governance, the fight against corruption and social and economic development," he added. As Arab Spring uprisings toppled autocratic regimes in Tunisia, Egypt and Libya last year and pro-democracy protests brewed at home, the king announced political concessions.

***Mali Government Condemns Islamist Executions in North**

Mali's interim government has condemned the stoning death of two people by Islamist militants who control the country's north. In a statement Tuesday, the government said it learned of the killings with "indignation and astonishment" and denounced what it called the dark-age practice of stoning. It promised that the killings "will not go unpunished." The militant group Ansar Dine said it executed a man and a woman in the small town of Aguelhok on Sunday. A group spokesman says the unmarried couple committed adultery, and received "the punishment called for under Islam: death." Reports from the area said Islamist fighters placed the man and woman into holes and threw rocks at their heads until they died. At least 200 people watched the killings in the center of town. The government Tuesday repeated its vow to do all it can to retake the north.

***Afghanistan: Taliban cheers reopening of NATO supply line**

As the United States trumpeted its success in persuading Pakistan to end its seven-month blockade of supplies for NATO troops in Afghanistan, another group privately cheered its good fortune: the Taliban. One of the Afghan war's great ironies is that both NATO and the Taliban rely on the convoys to fuel their operations -- a recipe for seemingly endless conflict. The insurgents have earned millions of dollars from Afghan security firms that illegally paid them not to attack trucks making the perilous journey from Pakistan to coalition bases throughout Afghanistan -- a practice the U.S. has tried to crack down on but admits likely still occurs. Militants often target the convoys in Pakistan as well, but there have been far fewer reports of trucking companies paying off the insurgents, possibly because the route there is less vulnerable to attack.

***Bahrain crown prince urges police restraint over protests**

Bahraini protesters have staged rallies in the capital, Manama, and the eastern city of Sitra, calling for the downfall of Al Khalifa regime. The protesters in the capital called for a democratically elected government, saying they would not give in to the pressure by the regime. They also confirmed their resolve to continue in the way of claiming their rights. The anti-government demonstrators in Sitra chanted slogans against the Al Khalifa regime and demanded that the 'killers of the martyrs of the revolution' be brought to justice. Earlier on Sunday, Bahraini security forces attacked protesters in Sitra and injured several people. The Saudi-backed Bahraini forces used tear gas and rubber bullets to disperse the protesters.

***Clashes erupt between Yemeni security forces, militants in Sana'a**

Fierce clashes have erupted between militants and security forces near the Interior Ministry building in the Yemeni capital, Sana'a. At least 300 gunmen wearing security uniforms had entered the Interior Ministry building in central Sana'a overnight, a police official said on Tuesday. "They were recruited and sent from the defected military base in western Sana'a," he added. Witnesses have also heard explosions in the area. Meanwhile on Sunday, loyalists to toppled ruler Ali Abdullah Saleh took a number of Interior Ministry employees hostage, but released them shortly afterward.

***Storms cause widespread power failure across Pakistan: protests against outages turn violent**

Prolonged and widespread power outage in most of Pakistan's cities during scorching summer heat has triggered violent protests in most areas of the country. Coupled with hot and humid summer weather, the prolonged blackout has forced outraged citizens to take to the streets to protest the tough living conditions. The protests turned violent as some of the angry protesters reportedly attacked offices of the power supply department in Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, damaging official and private properties. Offices of Pepco, the Pakistan Electric Power Company, were also attacked in Islamabad, Abbottabad, Charsadda, Okara,

Multan, Mandi Bahauddin, Sialkot, and Sheikhupura and many of them were reportedly set ablaze. No loss of life was reported, but the roads were blocked till late night. Reports indicate that in some areas people face 12 to 14 hours of rolling blackouts, while the rural residents suffer up to 18 hours of power outage.

***Kuwait MPS boycott revived parliament amid crisis**

Kuwait parliament failed Tuesday to hold its first session after it was reinstated by a court ruling as a majority of MPs boycotted the meeting amid a lingering political crisis. Speaker Jassem al-Khorafi adjourned the session for next week after only six MPs of the 50-member house and several cabinet ministers turned up for the meeting boycotted by both pro-government and opposition lawmakers. Opposition MPs declined to attend saying the parliament was illegitimate while pro-government members stayed away because of the government's refusal to pledge that it will not dissolve the house again.

***Grid failure for 300 million across India**

***India hit by second grid collapse in two days: 620 million without power in larger outage**

India's Northern power grid crashed on Monday morning wreaking havoc at airports, railway and metro stations, hospitals and across traffic congested roads, its worst power outage in a decade. Officials conceded that the power breakdown, the first such in over a decade, was caused primarily by the huge demand for electricity which is simply not available. Power Minister Sushil Kumar Shinde declared that he could not pinpoint what led to the breakdown but had constituted a committee to inquire into it. The chaos generated by these frequent power cuts- know euphemistically as 'load shedding'- lead frequently to protests and unrest on the streets. A fortnight earlier angry crowds gathered in one up-market South Delhi neighbourhood blocking traffic and clashing with the police after not having had power for over 48 hours.
